PASSAGE #5—

Deuteronomy 6:4-9, especially Verses 4-5

Sunday, June 8, 2025 to Sunday, July 6, 2025

⁴Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one.
⁵Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with
all your soul and with all your strength. ⁶These
commandments that I give you today are to be on your
hearts. ⁷Impress them on your children. Talk about them
when you sit at home and when you walk along the road,
when you lie down and when you get up. ⁸Tie them as
symbols on your hands and bind them on your
foreheads. ⁹Write them on the doorframes of your houses
and on your gates. (Deuteronony 6:4-9, New International Version).

Written by: Moses wrote the Book of Deuteronomy, which is in fact a collection of his sermons to the Israelites just before they crossed the Jordan River to enter the Promised Land after their escape from Egypt, (see Deuteronomy 1:1).

Date: 1406 B.C.; seventy days prior to Israel entering Canaan, given their thirty days of mourning Moses' death, (see Deuteronomy 1:3; 34:8 and Joshua 4:19).

Deuteronomy 6:4-9 is called the "Shema", which is the Hebrew word for its first word, "Hear." This passage is one of the most important and wellknown in all of Judaism. Throughout the centuries, it has been used as a prayer to guide God's people to honor Him as the only God, and to follow His commandments as essential for godly living and pleasing the LORD.
